## The Meaning of Marriage

One way the Bible describes what God is up to in the world is through the figure of marriage. God is drawing mankind into a relationship with Himself by uniting us with His Son Jesus in Marriage, *The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a marriage for his son* (Matt 22:2).

Not only does Jesus teach us to think of God's redeeming work in terms of marriage, but we learn from Rev 21:9-11 that the climactic event of all history is the wedding of Christ and the church.

- I. God's pursuit of humanity as His bride is nothing new. We read of it throughout the O.T.
  - A. At Sinai God took Israel to be His bride Ezek 16:8-14
    - 1. Yet after only 40 days she broke covenant w/ the gold calf.
    - 2. Her unfaithfulness was legendary.
  - B. But even in the midst of her unfaithfulness God promises to do something to transform her into a faithful bride Hosea 2:14-23
    - 1. In the N.T. we learn how this is accomplished Eph 5:25-27
      - a. The sacrifice of Christ on her behalf is effectual.
      - b. Clean, holy, radiant, w/out blemish
    - 2. On the last Day when His redeeming love has accomplished its work, she will be unveiled and nobody will think that the marriage is a mismatch, which is amazing when you consider the caliber of the groom.
- II. Marriage is about Christ and the church (Eph 5:32). Paul is teaching us how to think Biblically about the *meaning* of marriage and derive applications from this paradigm. Based on this model, Doug Wilson makes the following observations regarding masculinity and femininity, which we will now consider:
  - A. Christlike Masculinity in husbands (vv. 25-28)
    - 1. *Initiative*:
      - a. Jesus was not passive in regards to our salvation.
        - (1) We did not choose Him, but He chose Us.
        - (2) We love, because He *first* loved us.
      - b. This is how masculinity grasps the initiative.
        - (1) Husbands, what is your vision? What are your goals? Where are you leading your family?
        - (2) Sitting around squandering time is a functional denial of masculinity.
    - 2. *Authority*:
      - a. Christ illustrates what authority is and how it is used. He leads, rules & cmnds w/ the interest of His bride in mind.
      - b. In <u>2Cor 10:8</u> Paul says that God given authority is to be used for the *edification* of those we lead, and not *for your destruction*.
    - 3. *Sacrifice*:
      - a. Jesus willingly gave His life.
      - b. Not only did He do this at the cross, but He also did this throughout the course of His sacrificial *life*.

- 4. Responsibility:
  - a. Jesus did not just die *instead* of His bride, He died *on account of* His bride.
  - b. whatever *issues* your wife may have, you must not think of them as *her* problems, but as *your* problems.

## B. **Femininity in wives:** (vv. 22-24)

- 1. *Submission:* biblically speaking, submission is a demeanor or attitude.
  - a. NOT A wife who flinches, Or cowers.
  - b. It IS an attitude which supports rather than competes.
  - c. The world's hatred of the word *submission* is actually the world's hatred of loveliness in wives.
- 2. *Gratitude:* A central characteristics of the church is gratitude to Christ.
  - a. Gratitude and thanksgiving lie at the center of femininity.
  - b. Giving thanks to a husband (who works, provides, protects, and leads) is closely related to *respect*, which wives are called to in v.33.
- 3. *Responsiveness*: A husband cannot lead a wife who will not follow, who will not assist, who will not support and help.
- III. None of these characteristics are possible as individuals. They are relational in nature:
  - A. He does not sit *here*, being masculine, with her over *there*, being feminine.
  - B. He initiates, and she responds. He sacrifices, and she is grateful, He honors her in love and she gives him respect.
  - C. And this glorious dance should pervade every aspect of their lives. He *bows*, and then she *curtsies*.

When husbands and wives refuse to conform themselves to these qualities it is more than just sinning against some particular law here or there. It is a lie about Christ and the church.
